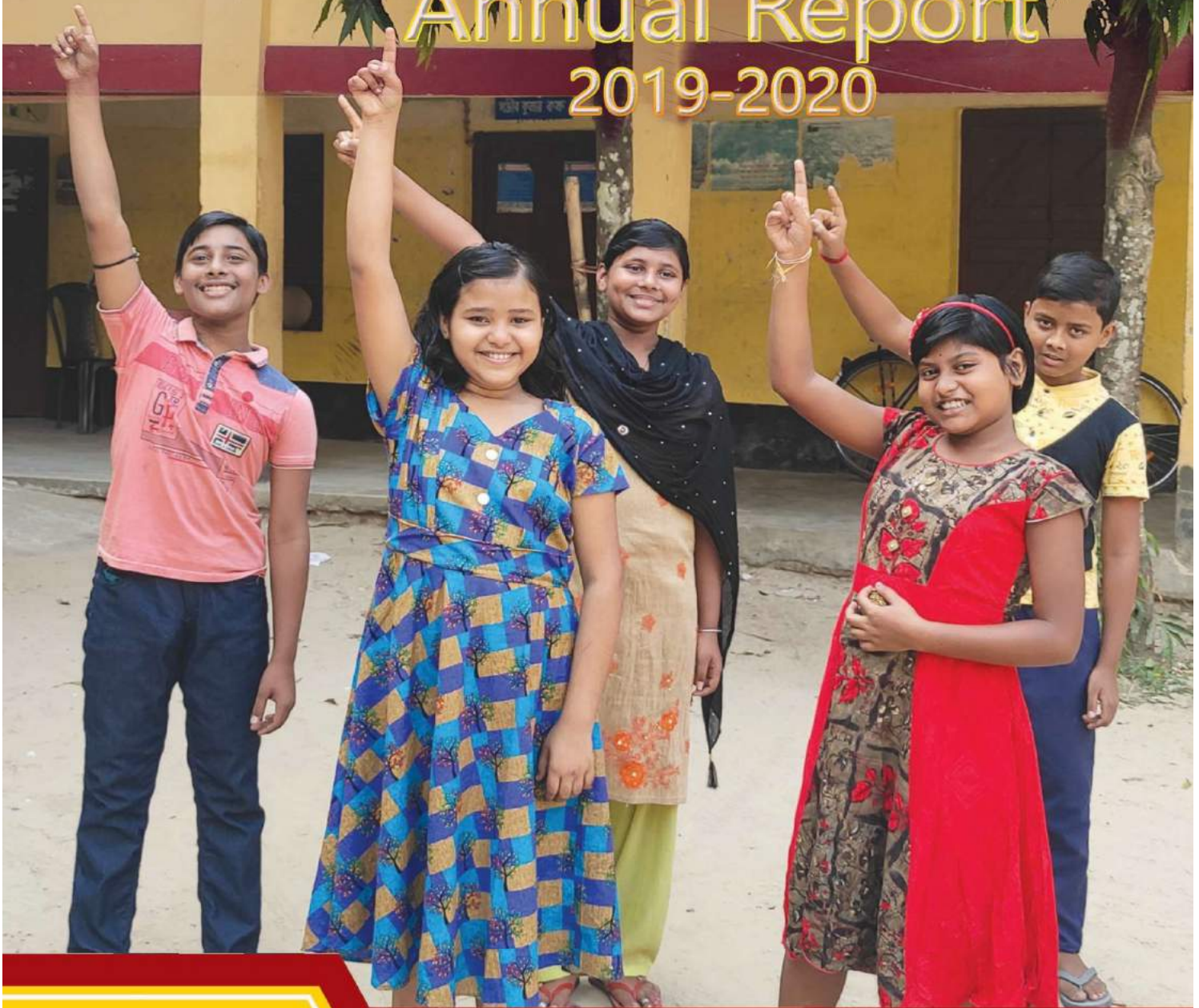

Introduction

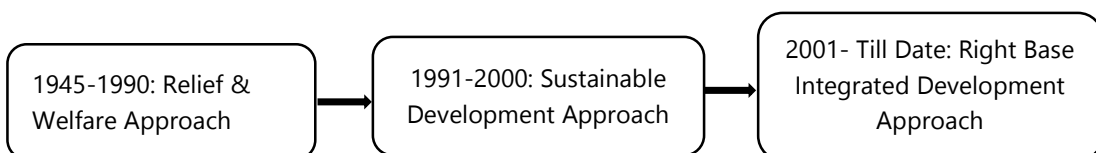
The villages (Sarada, Kajla, Hinch, Parulia, Baghdadari) are in the coastal belt of Contai Sub-division in the district of East Midnapur of West Bengal and are affected by recurrence of flood cyclone, inundation with saline water, impeded drainage, indiscriminate de-forestation, mono cropping land and occasional drought. The people earn their livelihood through engagement in agriculture, from fishing in deep sea, daily wage earning and also by making and selling local handicraft products made from bamboo, cane, and leaves from palm and dates trees. The villagers in general suffer from malnutrition and various diseases like dysentery, worm, skin etc. Maximum people of backward community has been migrated to others districts and state.

In this backdrop, the then social workers felt an immense urge to form a platform to perceive the problems and to take the remedial measures. Accordingly, Kajla Jana Kalyan Samity (JKKS) took the shape in 1945 before we got independence the struggle for freedom carried out during the period especially under the leadership of great freedom fighter. Deshapran Birendranath Sasmal also motivated the local people to form the organization.

In the year 1945 considering the socio-economic condition of the community where there was acute problem of accessing essential aspects viz food insecurity, poor communication & telecom facility, poor education and health opportunities etc. there were urgency to develop village infrastructure viz. Construction of roads, schools, hospitals, supplying food and fodder etc. For that purpose, the organization was motivated to follow the philanthropic and welfare approach.

Before 1990 the socio-economic condition of the people had been upgraded; condition of roads, health services, education facilities etc. had been improved. But some cultural changes had taken place; morality and values of people had gone downward and people became over dependent on services and amenities provided by the Government and other institutions. As a consequence, creative and positive thinking hardly lasted in the minds of people. Indiscrimination, corruption, violence, injustice and selfishness had taken place in the society. For that purpose, the organization worked to develop alternative model for people to bring back their positive and creative attitude.

In this manner another decade gone but social evils viz. Corruption, indiscrimination, violation of human rights etc. have gone high and public distribution system and other basic services and amenities have gone private. In addition to that people were devoid of constitutional rights. Since as per our constitutional provision the Government is accountable to fulfill basic needs of people. The organization believes that development is not possible until people become aware of their rights and raise their voice to fulfill their basic needs. For that purpose, the organization follows the Rights based integrated approach.



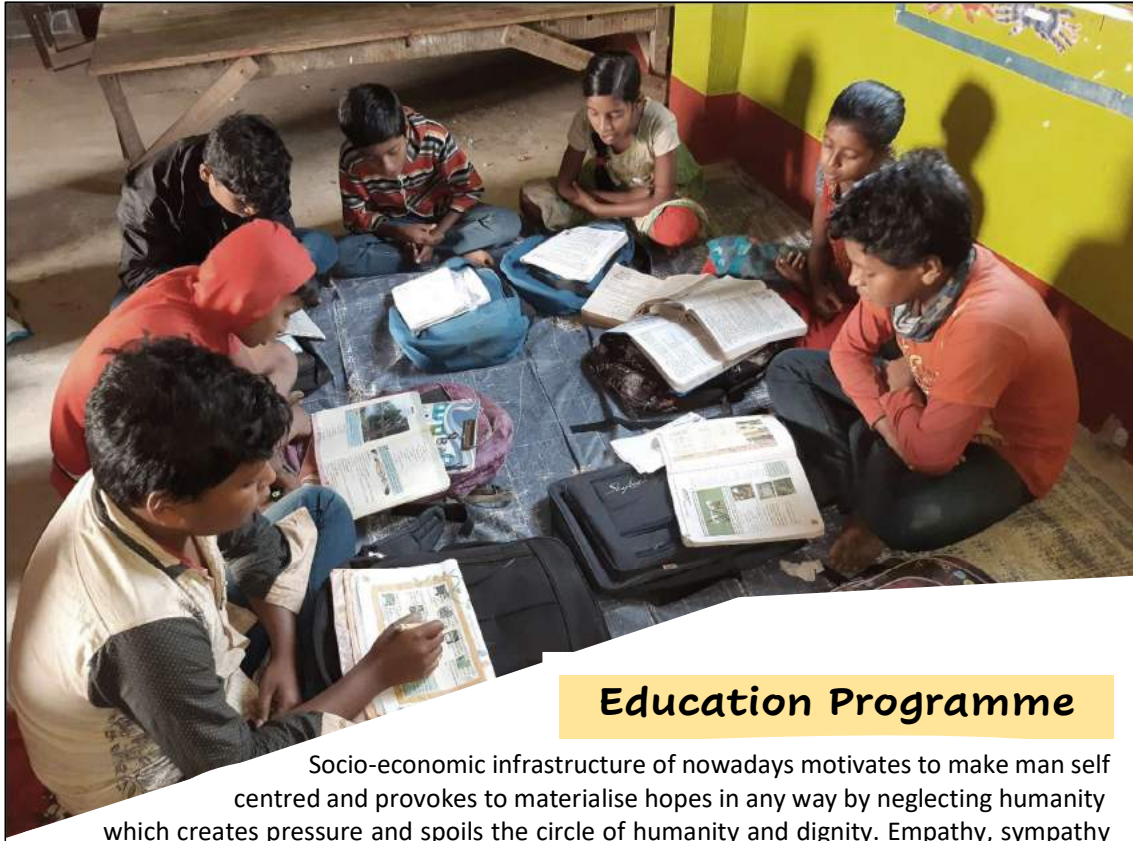

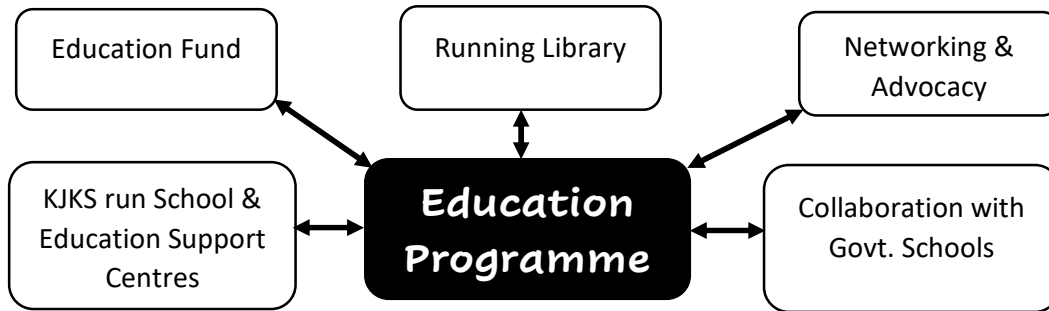


Education Programme

Socio-economic infrastructure of nowadays motivates to make man self centred and provokes to materialise hopes in any way by neglecting humanity which creates pressure and spoils the circle of humanity and dignity. Empathy, sympathy and love all these words are found in dictionaries. Men forget and neglect tradition, conventional ways of thinking. Only proper education is the way to strengthen humanity. KJKS works intensively for joyful teaching learning since 1992 by keeping all the incidents in mind at East Medinipur, South 24 Parganas and Jhargram Dt.

Major Achievements during the Year:

- 739 children of the marginalised community become avail class wise standard education through remedial and joyful teaching learning process.
- E-Learning is introduced in 2 HS Schools and 11 Primary Schools (Govt.) at South 24 Parganas and Purba Medinipur Dt.
- Regularity of children attendance at schools of the project becomes enhanced by 85%.
- A Class room is developed at Chenuasuli village with the initiation and help of Fisher Folk Community & Villagers.
- 86 child labours are rescued from their working place and mainstreamed.
- 51 school dropouts are mainstreamed.
- 14 Nutrition Gardens are developed at Govt Schools what enrich the food basket of the Mid-Day-Meal of schools.
- 17 poor but meritorious children are supported with scholarships for continuing their study.



In the current year, Kajla Janakalyan Samity has provided direct education to 6988 children and indirectly benefited about 15,000 children and parents from the education program.

Anima Dey Education Fund

An annual scholarship was given to 17 poor but meritorious students are supported by giving monthly scholarships from this fund which is given by Dr. Arun Sekhar Dey in memories of Anima Dey. 145 students are also supported by given learning materials this year 2019-2020. Total Rs. **130285/-** are expenses this year from this fund.

Story of Ankita

Ankita Mahapatra inhabits at Pataspur of Purba Medinipur. She took admission at Zoology Hons, at Belada College but she faced lots of problem to continue her education for the financial crunch. She applied for financial support to KJKS and she got support. At last she completed her study with good marks.

Story of Kriti Pal

Kriti Pal D/O- Harekrishna Pal lives at Parulia Village of Desapran Block under Purba Medinipur Dt.> Her father earns their livelihood by rendering private tuition> She faced a lot of problems during her study of Nursing. By getting support from KJKS she completed her study and now works at Nilratan Sarkar Hospital as a nurse. She said, "The support not only helps to continue the study but also make her more strong and raise self-confidence to continue the study and make iron minded."



Networking & Advocacy

Kajla Janakalyan Samity is associated with the state level "West Bengal Education Network" and "Right to Education Forum". In the current year, Kajla Janakalyan Samity has participated in various meetings on Right to Education Act, pass-fail system and National Education Policy from being associated with the above two networks. Besides, the organization has discussed with the president of the District Primary Education Council to introduce e-learning system in schools in South 24 Parganas district and e-learning system has been inaugurated in 5 schools by the president of District Primary Education Council.

Impact of Education Program during the Year:

- Arrah GP of Nayagram block allotted Rs.120000/- for the celebration of Children Day and Child Rights Week during the Financial Year 2019-2020.
- There is no school dropout below 14 yrs. at the projected area.
- A better relationship is developed with various schools of the projected area.
- Three Children Fair was organised at Three Cluster where more than 3500 children were present during the Financial Year 2019-2020.



Child Protection Programme

Children of almost all families are mostly vulnerable in our society irrespective of their economic status. It is vivid in all the media platform, at present the children are facing different types of vulnerabilities in present socio-economic and cultural scenario.

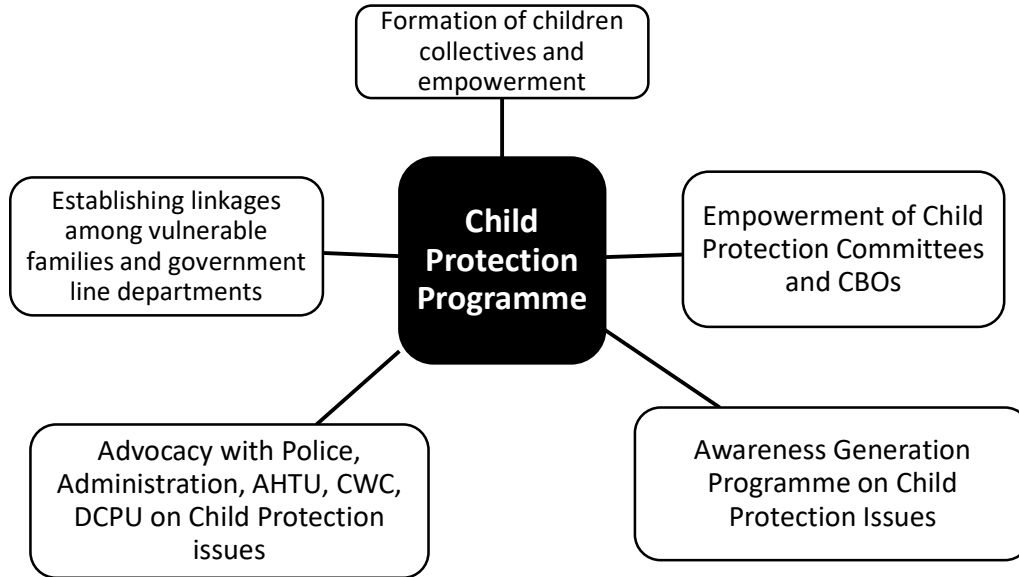
Our organization believes that a pro-children society can be formed by activating government system and by empowering the people of family and society- where the children will be well protected and the society will be free from any types of exploitation, neglect, physical and mental harassment, trafficking etc.

Kajla Janakalyan Samity has continued to implement all activities of “Integrated Child Protection Scheme” to prevent all types’ of child abuse during 2019-20 in the districts of Purba Medinipur, South 24 Parganas and Jhargram.

In the current year, Kajla Janakalyan Samity has been able to directly reach 7500 children and adults through child protection programs and indirectly benefited 25000 people.

Achievements of Child Protection Programme in this year:

- Mohanpur Gram Panchayat of Magrahat-II block under South 24 Parganas district is declared as “Child Friendly Gram Panchayat” by the Government of West Bengal.
- 147 event of child marriage has been stopped in Purba Medinipur, Jhargram and South 24 Parganas in assistance with district administration.
- Nine (9) trafficked women and children are rescued and rehabilitated in the society through the initiative of the organization in assistance with Child Protection Committee and administration.
- 4 children of Purba Medinipur district are being provided Rs.2000/- monthly under “Sponsorship Programme” of ICPS, on recommendation of District Child Protection Unit, through the joint initiative of Kajla Janakalyan Samity and Child Protection Committees
- In this year 7 children are being awarded for their bravery from Gram Panchayat, Block and Districts.
- 2315 vulnerable children and old aged are being covered under different facilities of Government Schemes.

Kajla Janakalyan Samity is engaged with different networks or alliances of child protection and pursuing advocacy with District Administration, State and SCPCR. KJKS is engaged with an alliance viz. CACL for many years.



Mousumi Mondal is a resident of Harinapasdal village of Bhajachauli Gram Panchayat under Contai-III Block in Purba Medinipur district. She is 17 years old. She has never seen her father till her birth. Her father, Bablu Mondal left her mother long days ago. Since then Kamini Mondal, mother of Sumi nurtured her, Father of Kamini Mondal, Jhareswar Kamila is very poor. Maternal uncle and maternal grandfather of Sumi was looking after her. But once her mother left home being married to another person –when she could not bear loneliness. Maternal uncle of Mousumi denied to look after her. Then maternal grandfather of started to live in hut at the bank of a river.

Kajla Jana Kalyan Samity has started their activities on child protection issues in Bhajachauli Gram Panchayat. At a meeting with VLPCPC the staff of KJKS came to the helpless condition of Mousumi and her grandfather. A decision was taken to apply for getting benefit of sponsorship programme of ICPS. Accordingly, VLPCPC of Harinapasdalbar sent the resolution of their meeting to the DCPU of Purba Medinipur.

Representatives of Contai-III and DCPU inspected the worst situation of Mousumi and her grandfather. Nilkamal Ghorai, Upa-Pradhan of Bhajachauli Gram Panchayat, maintained liaison with the district administration regularly as if she gets the facilities of sponsorship programme as early as possible.

At last, Mousumi was nominated for getting the benefits of sponsorship programme in the month of July,2020. Now District Social Welfare Department is providing Rs. 2,000/- per month for running her expenses on education, clothing and health.

Mousumi has grown up combating economic and social crisis and she has passed H.S. in 2020 from local High School. Presently, she is studying at local College in Vocational stream.

In the words of Mousumi, *“I am very much lucky. KJKS and VLPCPC has felt my problems and constraints. Through their advocacy, I am getting Rs.2000/- per month. I am inspired to live and to continue my education through this great initiative of them,”*



Local Youth Club member with the help of police to bring back to home one eloped girl

Joyenkhan Janakalyan Samity is a local club located at Jhinkirhat Bazar under Mohanpur Gram Panchayat. Club members used to come to one place regularly and play games. Although the club is very old, at present almost all the members of this club are young. Under the management of Mohanpur Gram Panchayat and Kajla Janakalyan Samity, training was provided to the members of the club on prevention of child trafficking, child marriage, school dropouts and child labor, etc. They understood that club members also have an important role to play in ensuring child protection. The president of the Joyenkhan Janakalyan Samity, said: "It is very important to stop all kinds of child abuse. Otherwise we will fall behind. So, if there is any problem related to children in different parts of the village, we go ahead to solve it". Also added that "Nandita Kandra, 13, of Jayenkhan village was lured away by a boy from Sonarpur. We have worked in regular contact with the police administration, BDO and Kajla Janakalyan Samity to rescue this girl. Eventually the girl was rescued with the help of police. "

Amar Kandra's daughter Nandita Kandra was born on 25.06.2006. Her mother Tagari Kandra is a homemaker. Her father is rickshaw puller. They are the resident of Joyenkhan, PO- South Mohanpur, PS- Magrahat under South 24 Parganas district. Nandita Kandra was a seventh grader at Mohanpur KKGK Institution. Nandita Kandra came out of the house one afternoon to go to Jhinkirhat for private tuition.

When the evening passed, the girl did not return to home, the mother was terrified and started searching for the neighbors' houses. But did not find. In the morning, her mother met with the Panchayat member Madhuri Halder. The panchayat member listens the incident and advised to her to inform the Village Child Protection Committee and local club Joyenkhan Janakalyan Samity.

Club members took the initiative to inform all the members of the Child Protection Committee and arranged an immediate meeting. A meeting was held in the presence of the members of the Child Protection Committee and an application was written for the rescue of the missing Nandita Kandra. The girl's parents, including a representative of a local club and a representative of the Child Protection Committee, met BDO of Magrahat-II Block. After informing BDO about the incident, he asked him to submit a copy of the resolution of the committee and immediately called the OC of Magrahat Police Station and directed him to investigate the incident. After that they went to Magrahat Police Station as per the instructions of BDO and made a diary. Whose number was 1173, dated 21.10.2019.

Police began the investigation on the next day. Couldn't find her. After searching for Facebook, WhatsApp, phone location etc. for two days, the police of Magrahat Police Station got a report that Nandita Kandra was found in Barindra Para, Rajpur - Sonarpur area. Malay Karmakra's son hid the 15-year-old Karmakar's daughter.

The members of the club went to Sonarpur and collected various information from the people around Malay Karmakar's house and informed the police of Magrahat police station. They found out that a girl had been brought home a few days ago but is no longer seen. Malay Karmakar and his son are involved in various anti-social activities. Neighbors are outraged their behaviour and attitude.

Police later came to know that Pranay Karmakar used to come to the house of a neighbor in Joyankhan village from time to time. Then the police filed an FIR in the name of Malay Karmakar (Father of Pranay Karmakar) on the basis of the application of Tagari Kandra, whose number was 401/19 under IPC section 363, 365 dated 23/10/2019. Magrahat police kept in touch with Sonarpur Police Station on a regular basis. Although he could not find her for the first time, they rescued the girl within a month and handed her over to her parents.

The mother then kept the girl for some time at the house of a relative in the village next to Tagari Kandra. Members of the village youth club come to persuade the rescued Nandita to go back to school. After bringing the girl back home, her parents arranged for her to send to school. The members of the youth club helped Nandita in her studies.



Tapoban Sishu Abas

Kajla Janakalayan Samity is running a children home under JJ Act, viz. 'Tapoban Sishu Abas' for the children in need of care and protection to provide safe childhood. This home is registered under Department of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare. At present 37 children are residing there. Eleven (11) fulltime staff and nineteen (19) volunteers are engaged for providing services to the children for their holistic development.

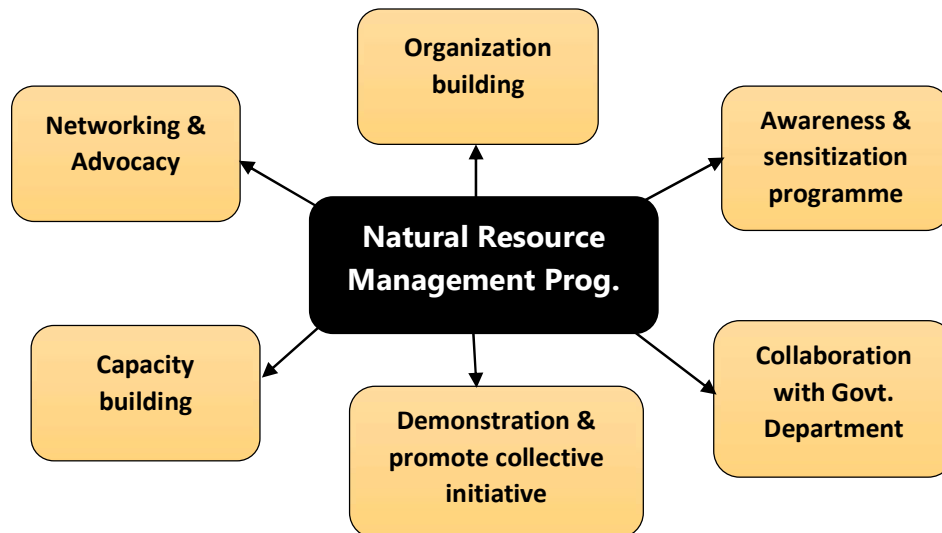

Natural Resource Management Programme

Basudeb Singh of Jarighanti village in Jhargram district has been able to earn Rs 24,000 annually by growing organic vegetables on his 0.30 acre of fallow land. Local paddy sales center has been set up at Kharor village in East Midnapore district at the initiative of Maharudrajayi Farmers Group from which hundreds of farmers in the area can easily procure local seeds at fair prices.

The organization has implemented various natural resource management programs in 10 blocks of East Midnapore and one of the most vulnerable & dry block Nayagram under Jhargram district to ensure non-toxic and environmentally friendly agriculture and livelihood related to agriculture through proper management of natural resources. During this reporting year the following major activities have been implemented under this program. . .

Bio-Lab

In order to increase the supply of organic and bacterial fertilizers in the area, the Society has produced and supplied 7.7 tons of organic and bacterial fertilizers such as Trichoderma VDT, Azotobacter, PSB, Trichosol, Azosperilum and vermi compost from its own laboratory. The liquid Trichoderma VDT also made 15 liters and 200 pieces of mushroom spawn and supplied it to the farmers in the area.

Impact of the programme:

During this reporting year the society has noticed the following impact after successfully implemented the different activities under this program

- Biodiversity has been brought and quality production has been enhanced by 1461 farmers of East Midnapore & Jhargram district through water conservation, optimum utilization of land, diversified of land structure, watershed activities and proper use of animal resources.
- 1471 farmers have skilled on the procedures of various organic manure productions at their homes and they have produced different manure and using various organic fertilizers in their cultivation purpose as regular basis. They have been able to reduce the use of chemical fertilizers.
- 310 hectares of land under two districts have cultivated by the use of organic fertilizers
- Average additional income Rs.2000/- per year has been increased among 1471 farmers by the executed of different initiatives under this programme.

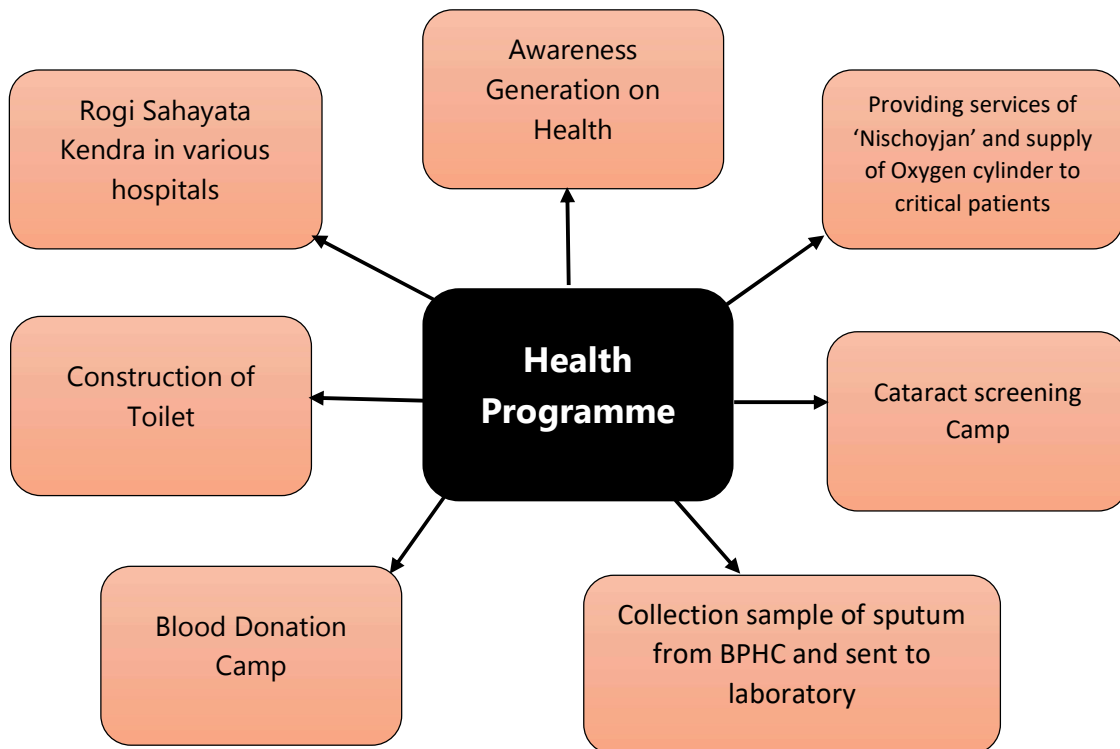
In the last 2019-2020 financial year, a total of 700 farmers have been involved in 'Krishak Bandhu Scheme' in 4 camps in Heria, Lakhi and Tikashi gram panchayat areas of Khejuri-I block of Purba Medinipur district with the initiative of members of 74 farmer groups and Kajla Janakalyan Samity. Through this initiative direct financial assistance of Rs. 1500 / - has been provided.

Parul Mahata lives at Rakhalbon under Arrah GP of Nayagram Block under Jhargaram Dt. Her family has 52 decimal upper lands. She cultivates various types of vegetables during last two seasons. She is able to turn his land to double cropping from mono cropping. She earns Rs.24000/- additionally by produced cauliflower, bitter gourd, radish, tomato, brinjal etc.



Health Programme

Kajla Janakalyan Samity is implementing Community Health Management since its inception in collaboration with health wing of the organisation and health infrastructure of the government. The objective of KJKS is to ensure various health services of the government to the people by which mortality rate of mother & child can be reduced and the spread of infectious diseases can be prevented.



5759 people are benefitted directly from health programme and 2.5 lakhs people are benefitted indirectly.

He was suffering from a critical disease but was unable to treat himself for insufficiency of money. One "Rogi Sahayak" of KJKS went to his house and discussed about the services and facilities of the "Sasthya Sathi" card.

After that Dipak received the health services at free of cost using "Sasthya Sathi" card. Now he is cured and fit. Now, Dipak discussed the usefulness of the card among his neighbor.

Bipin Das, a resident of Contai-III block of Purba Medinipur district was suffering from cough and cold for long days. He was under the treatment of a quack doctor. One volunteer of KJKS advised him to test his sputum. He neglected his advise. But he has done the sputum test when he was feeling more weak. He was diagnosed as a TB patient. He was treated in a government hospital for six months. Now he is completely cured.

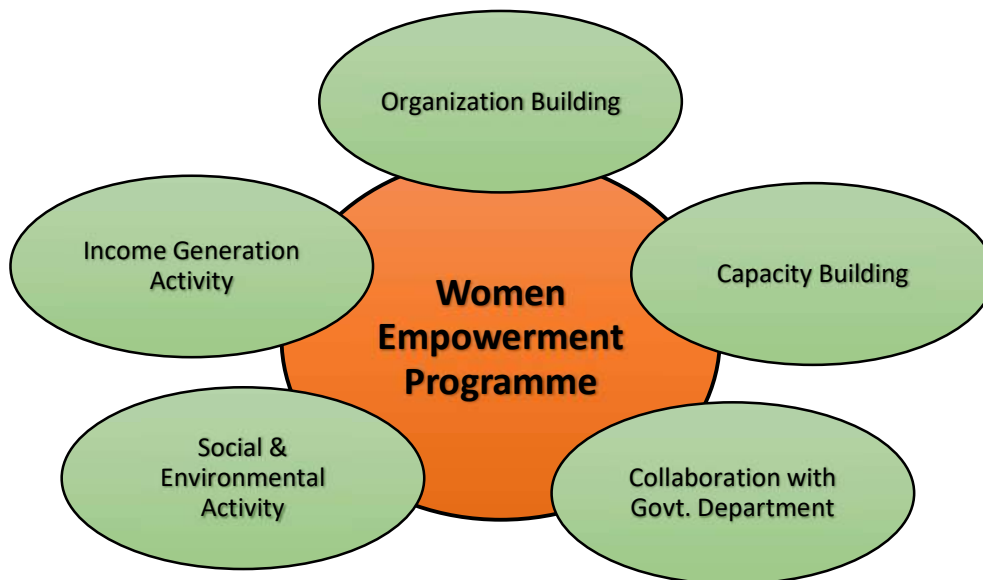




Women Empowerment Programme

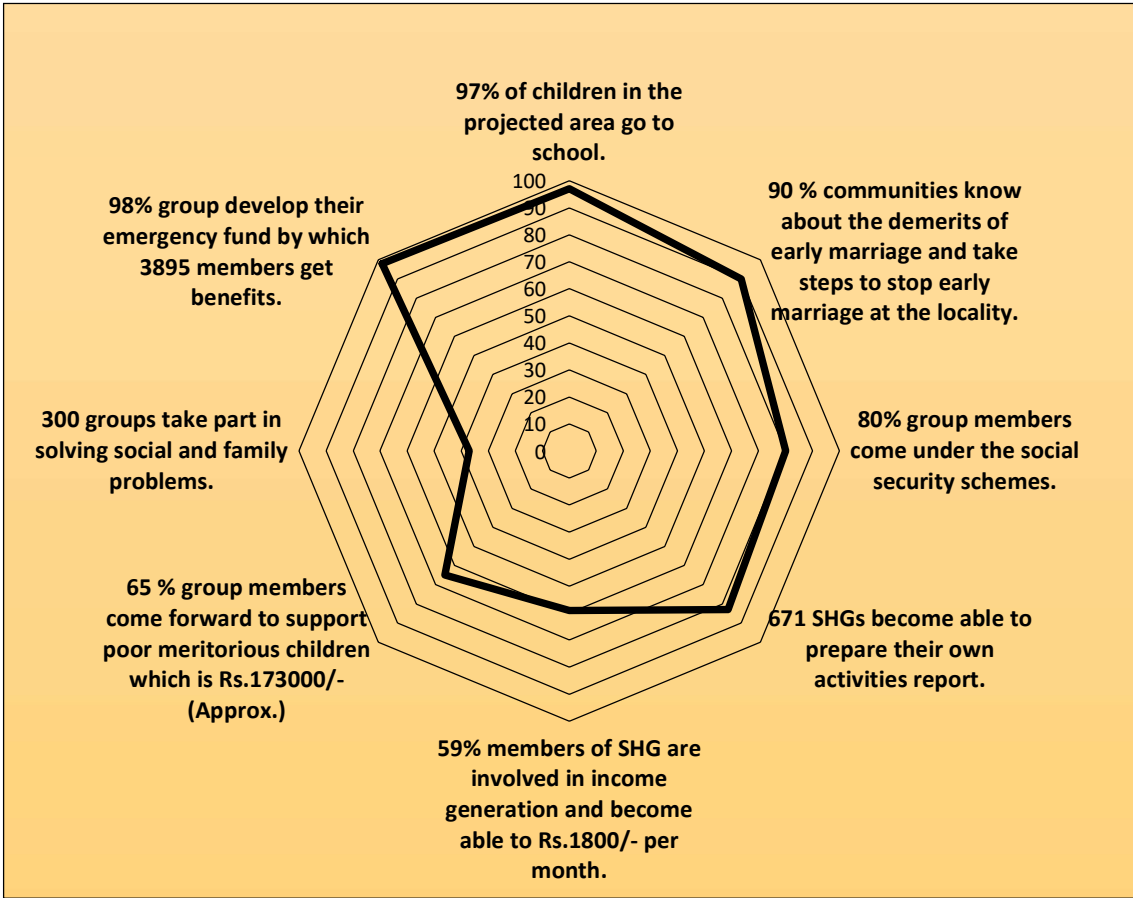

Impact of these Activities:



- 97% of children in the projected area go to school.
- 90 % communities know about the demerits of early marriage and take steps to stop early marriage at the locality.
- 80% group members come under the social security schemes.
- 671 SHGs become able to prepare their own activities report.
- 59% members of SHG are involved in income generation and become able to Rs.1800/- per month.
- 65 % group members come forward to support poor meritorious children which is Rs.173000/- (Approx.)
- 300 groups take part in solving social and family problems.
- 98% group develop their emergency fund by which 3895 members get benefits.



An arrangement on marriage of a 14 yrs girl with a bride of different state was going on at Birampur under Contai-1 block then the villagers informed it to the members of Matangini & Sagarika SHG. Members of SHG go to the girl's house and give conception about the demerits of early marriage to the concerning family and bride's family. Then they became able to do that and took initiation for mainstreaming the 14 yrs girl.



Sefali Patra, a group leader of Sarswati Group of Contai-I Block went through a huge problem as she was the only earning member of the family and her husband was suffering from a disease. Then she took loan of Rs.60000/ in three steps from KJKS and started a business by establishing a Pan Stall and now she becomes the owner of a Grocery shop and earns Rs.2000/- per day of which Rs.250/- -Rs.300/- is her profit. She becomes able to pass her son Madhayamik Parikha & her daughter HS and to continue her husband's treatment by taking support from this income. So Sefali said "We should have to follow the path what shows by Kajla Janakalyan Samity."

Salema Khatun, a group leader of Najama Group is the inhabitant of Betalia Village of Contai –III block. She carries full responsibility for the family after the death of her father. She is the main earning members of the family. The then condition she took a loan of Rs.1000/, Rs,25000/- & Rs.50000/- in three steps from KJKS and started a business by establishing a Pan Stall and now she becomes the owner of a Grocery shop and she sells all the materials at fair prices. She maintains all the book keeping of her business own self. Now, she earns Rs.8000/- per day of which Rs.800/- -Rs.1000/- is her profit. Now she is no doubt self-dependent.



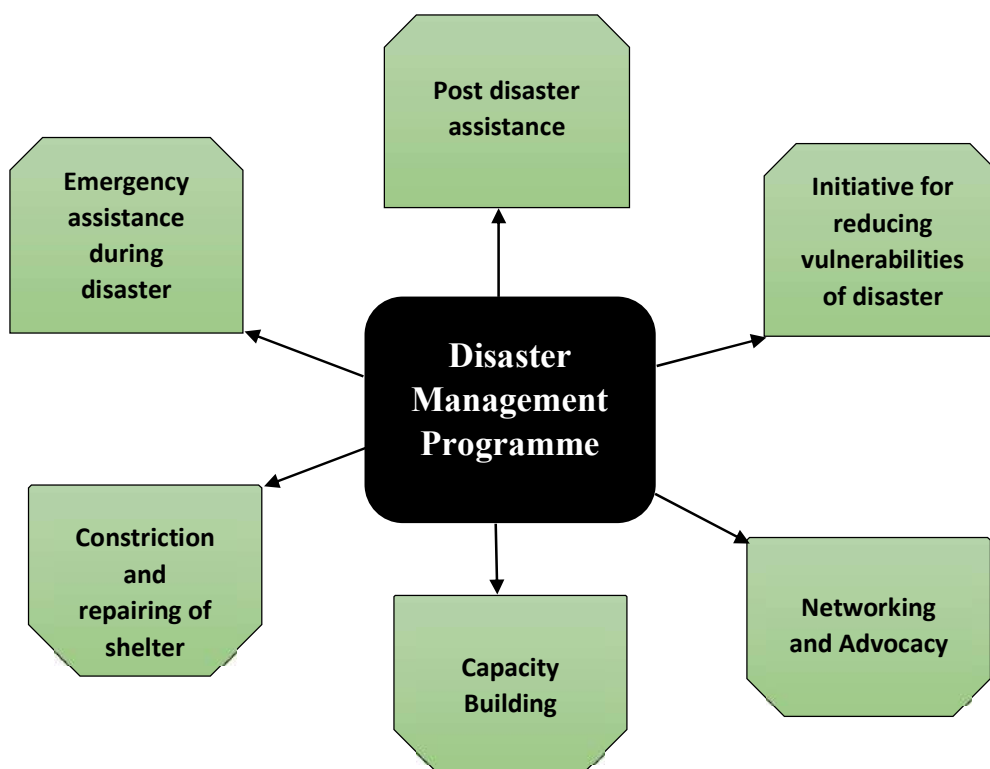
Disaster Management Programme

A wide range Purba Medinipur, Paschim Medinipur, Jhargram, North 24 Pgs and South 24 Pgs is lying on the Continental Shelf of Bay of Bengal and marked as disaster-prone area of West Bengal. Many of families are residing in muddy houses till date. Scarcity of proper shelter, food and drinking water is noticed among children, pregnant mother and old aged persons.

Kajla Janakalyan Samity is involved for many years to reduce the vulnerabilities created due to any type of disaster. The organisation is associated with various National and International organization and the department of disaster of Government of West Bengal. The main objective of this programme is to reduce vulnerabilities and loss of life by taking disaster management initiative.

Major Achievements:

- Training on disaster management is provided to the inmates of 19 Govt. run children home, shelter homes etc. supported by Directorate of Child Rights and Trafficking, GoWB & UNICEF. Through these trainings, vulnerabilities are assessed/ identified and a child friendly disaster management plan is also prepared,
- Problems and gaps are identified in 15 multi-purpose cyclone shelters and pro-people participatory plans are prepared to reduce the vulnerabilities of disaster.
- Some flood centers (shelters) are constructed with a joint initiative of Kajla Janakalyan Samity and Save the Children. These centers are not only used at the time of flood, but also these are used in social development purpose such as-running Coaching Centre, running library, organizing workshops and seminars etc.

Uses of Flood Shelter

There are 3 child centered flood shelter at 3 Gram Panchayats of Bhagawanpur-II, Patashpur-I & II blocks constructed with an initiative of Kajla Janakalyan Samity supported by Save the Children. A coaching center for 150 slow learners and irregular school going children is running at Pusha "Dishari" flood shelter organized by local youths. "Sonar Tori" flood shelter at Bamunda of Patashpur Gram Panchayat under Patashpur-II block is being used as rural library and "Mamatamoyee" flood shelter at Khejurgachhia of Arjun Nagar Gram Panchayat under Bhagawanpur-II block is being used for various training, meeting, seminar and workshops.

Networking and Advocacy

One meeting was held at the meeting hall of District Magistrate on preparedness & coordination among the stakeholders of 30 NGOs with an initiative of KJKS & district IAG. Besides this, 11 meetings are held on preparedness at the time of disaster organized by State IAG, West Bengal.

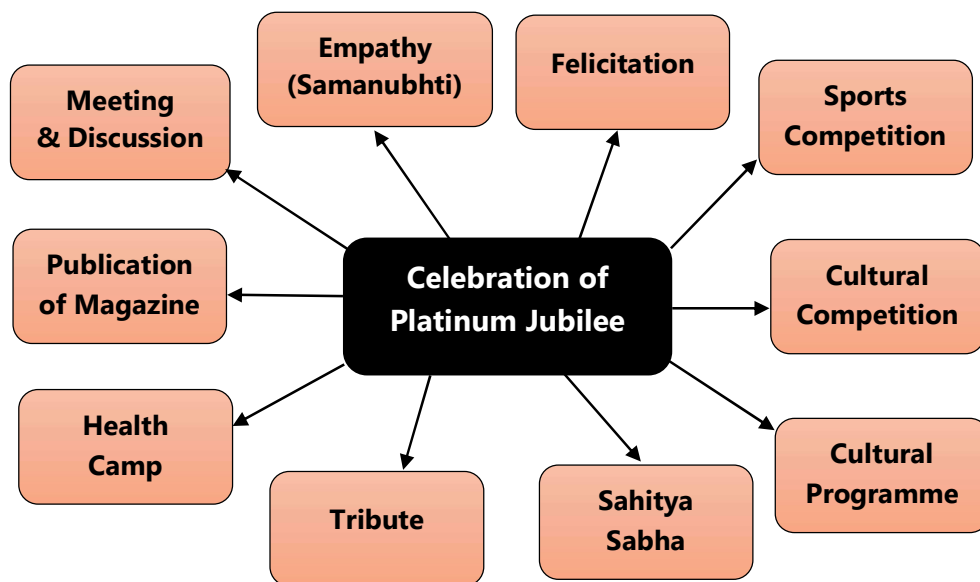

The concluding ceremony of completion of 75 years journey of the organization gratifies its stability and steady activities. It proves that creation of an indifferent public relation is possible through various cultural activities. The celebration of Platinum Jubilee is concluded through implementation of multi-purpose activities.



Kajla Janakalyan Samity has reached to 7612 people directly through implementation of above mentioned activities and the activities of last 75 years of the organization are visualized to more than a million people through social media.



Various Innovative Initiatives in Holistic Development

Kajla Janakalyan Samity has been taken various innovative initiatives preserving the village culture and cults since the inception of the organization. These initiatives are accelerated day by day in collaboration with the national level NGO "Goonj". KJKS and "Goonj" have taken various innovative activities jointly in Jhargram, Purba Medinipur & South 24 Pgs, such as, development of village by villagers, eradication of problems of girls during menstruation/ periods and initiative to prepare the children interested in study who are not interested to continue their studies. These innovative initiatives have drawn attention of common people as well as of dignitaries of those districts. Participants have been received clothes & other accessories in exchange of their services in the implemented activities.

Important activities and achievements:

- 4 acres of barren land is converted into fertile land at Nyagram Block in Jhargram district. At present Sabai grass and paddy are cultivated here.
- 38 cultivators of Rangamati are being motivated to cultivate applying organic methods of agriculture. These cultivators are involved now in preparing organic manure, composite gardening, preparation of fruits garden and nursery.
- 27 acres of land are being used for multi cropping which were used as single cropping land through water harvesting.
- 5220 person days are being created by the villagers for the activities related to development work of the villages in 2 blocks of Jhargram & South 24 Pgs.
- Assistancess are being provided in construction of 4 Anganwadi Centers, 6 Primary Schools, repairing of 2 High schools, library, construction of smokeless chulla, preparation of wormy compost peat. Accessories are being provided for making benches in schools and musical instruments are also distributed.
- Sanitary napkins are distributed to 710 eligible tribal girls so that they can understand the importance of using sanitary napkin during menstruation.
- Several taboos are observed among the girls during their menstruation/ periods. 17 meetings are organized in 9 villages with 2000 adolescent girls and women for building their awareness on the taboos.
- 110 pond of community and personal are re-excavated to reduce water pollution and mosquito borne diseases in South 24 Pgs district.
- 10 rural roads are repaired.
- 110 nutrition gardens are prepared and 11 check dams are being constructed. 2000 families are directly benefitted by this.
- Pump shoes and other articles are distributed to 2000 students of 17 schools (Primary & High) in Jhargram & South 24 Pgs to encourage them to come to school regularly.



Samanubhuti (Empathy)

Human being is being involved in eccentric development day by day. Side by side they have lost their values, morality, sympathy, empathy in all the fields. Their demand for consumables is increasing rapidly. But the organization believes that human being should not be single or separate. On the basis of the idea of German Philosopher Theodor Lipps's notions of empathy or aesthetic sympathy, KJKS adopted one programme viz, Samanubhuti (empathy)- a programme for old aged persons whose life are valueless to their kin. This is a tribute to them. In this year, 300 old aged persons of 23 villages are felicitated with various gift items.



Reduction of domestic violence and social meeting

KJKS has been working in the field of holistic development more than seven decades. The incidents of domestic violence are increasing in the project areas. To reduce these incidents the organization is continuously counselling the affected families. The organization is registered under Social Welfare department to provide services to protect domestic violence in Contai-III block of Purba Medinipur district.

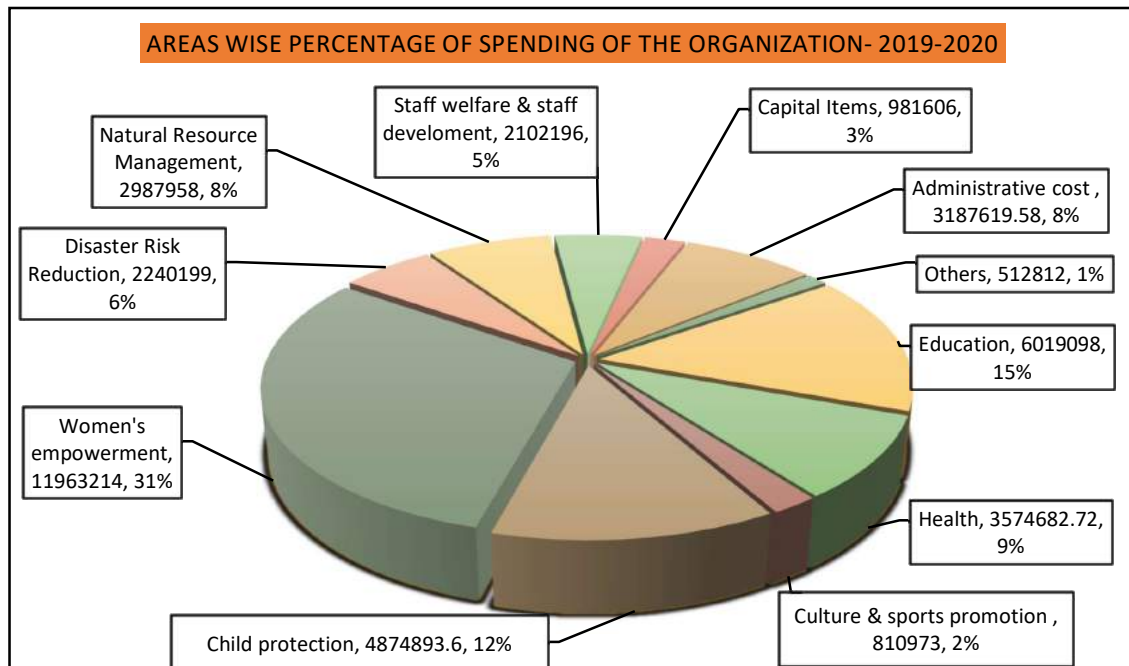

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT OF THE ORGANIZATION

KJKS has an efficient Accounts Department with six dedicated persons. The accounts are fully computerized and it maintaining with latest version of Tally software. The accounts persons maintain Bill, vouchers, registers, others related documents and work in close contact with the coordinators, Supervisors and field staff of the organization. The accounts department of the organization is followed the norms as per Financial Management policies of the organization as stated bellow...

- Cash basis system of accounting is followed in the organization.

- Maximum payments done NEFT, bank transfer and cheque.

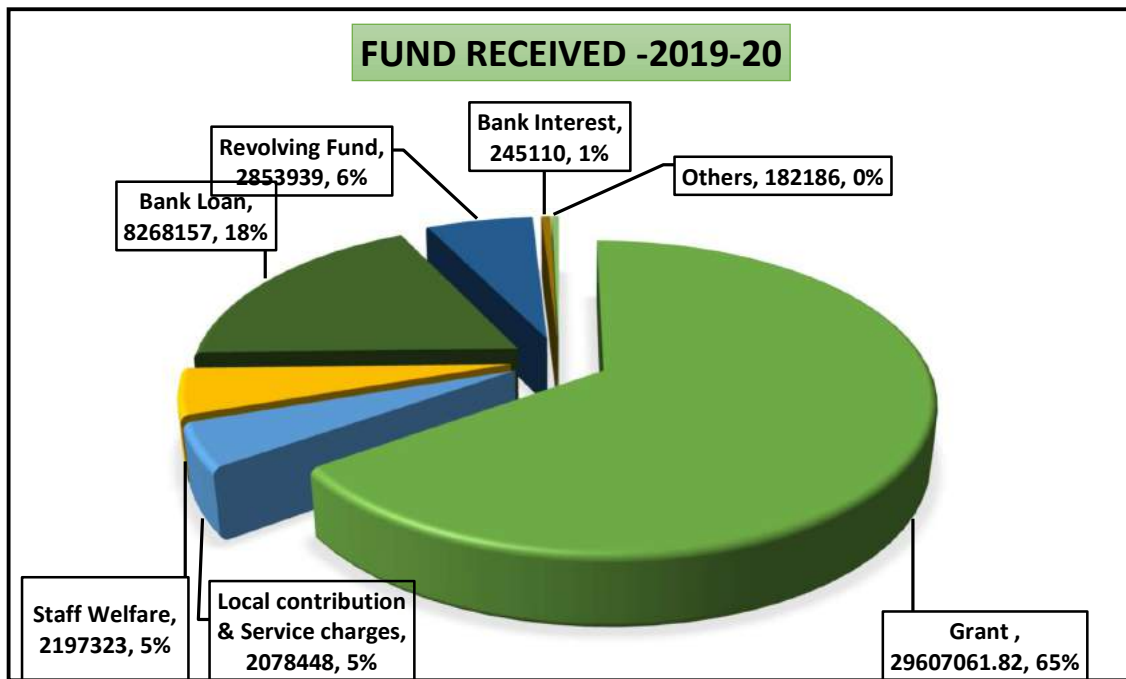


